The ceremony usually lasts about an hour; there is a short rehearsal (about 30 minutes) before the ceremony so that everyone knows where to stand, what to say and when, etc. Therefore, you don't have to worry about not knowing how to proceed.

You will find out the date and exact time of your graduation from the official invitation. Come in time!


You can invite your parents or other relatives to the graduation. Seating is provided, as well as the use of restrooms.


#### Women's attire

A cocktail dress, a suit with a skirt or trousers, or a dress will look elegant — for example, a little black dress is suitable, but it doesn't have to be all black. You can also choose a darker shade of bolder colours as colours can express an opinion. Wear stockings, wear pumps or ballerinas, and think about accessories. If you wear a perfume, choose a subtle fragrance.



#### Men's attire

A dark suit, with a classic white long-sleeved shirt and two inches of cuff showing would be ideal, and don't button the last button on your jacket. **Did you know that:** Academic officials performing at the graduation ("promoce" in Czech, from Latin *promotio*, from *pro-moveo*, push, support) wear a ceremonial robe reaching to the ankles – a gown ("talár" in Czech, from Latin *talus*, ankle), the expression of their authority and responsibilities are academic insignia – sceptres and chains. The way how to address academic officials is also ceremonial: the Rector – Your Magnificence (noble), the Dean – Spectabilis (famous), the Vice-Rector, Promotor and other officials – Honorabilis (respected, venerable).
